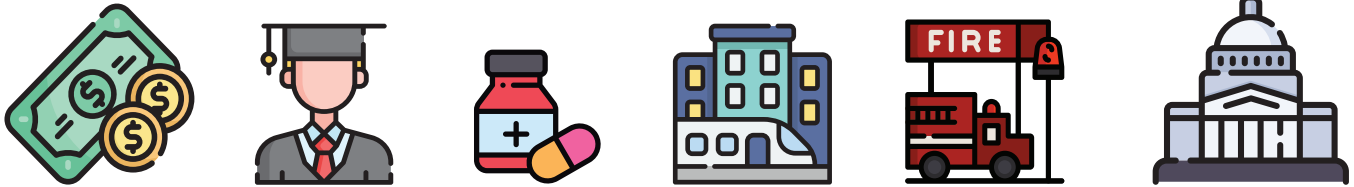


Census 2020: Get Counted Today!

WHAT IS THE CENSUS?

Every 10 years, the federal government is required to count **all residents** in the United States through a national Census—regardless of age or documentation status. Census 2020 is our only chance in the next 10 years to get a full and accurate count of our communities.

WHY DOES THE CENSUS MATTER?



- \$1.5 trillion in federal funding—or up to **\$2,000 per person per year**—for important programs like **health care, education, public safety, and infrastructure** relies on a complete count of residents
- A complete and accurate count of individuals will ensure proper **representation in government**




CENSUS CONFIDENTIALITY

Census information is confidential, and the Census will not ask for your citizenship or immigration status. The Census will also never ask for your social security number, money, or credit card information. If you suspect a scam, please notify a NEMS representative right away.

WAYS TO RESPOND

The last day to respond to the Census has been extended to **September 30, 2020.**

 Remember to respond before Census workers visit your household!

The three ways to respond to the 2020 Census are **online, by phone, or by mail.** Be sure to include everyone who lives at your address.



You can fill out the form online at my2020census.gov. You will be asked for a 12-digit Census ID, but you do not need the ID to fill out the Census.



You can call a dedicated toll-free number to speak with a live person in your preferred language of English, Spanish, Chinese (Mandarin or Cantonese), Vietnamese, Korean, Russian, Arabic, Tagalog, Polish, French, Haitian Creole, Portuguese, or Japanese.

If you have not responded by mid-April, the Census will mail you a paper form. But it will only be available in English or Spanish. For help with completing the paper form in your language, the Census provides language assistance guides in 59 languages.
